Introduction

Eastern Counties Regional Library (ECRL) began a strategic planning process in August 2024 with the assistance of a consulting firm. A provincial grant enabled ECRL to take this historic step. The goal was to have a completed three-year strategic plan by April 2025 to align with the beginning of the new provincial funding formula.

Unfortunately, the new provincial library funding formula was not implemented in April 2025 as anticipated, and ECRL did not receive a funding increase in the 2025-2026 provincial budget. Static funding levels and the lack of a new funding formula, which typically covers a five-year timeframe, mean that ECRL has no future financial information. Without a financial forecast, ECRL can't logically determine its activities or capacity for growth for the next three years. If ECRL does not receive a funding increase in the April 2026 budget, there is a significant risk that ECRL will have to consider service cuts due to current financial pressures.

On a positive note, our strategic planning process yielded incredibly valuable information and insights that we are acting on immediately. We have prepared a one-year Strategic Operational Plan for the 2025-2026 fiscal year. This document outlines our five strategic pillars along with the corresponding planned operational activities.

The table below, which contains data from the 2023-2024 Provincial Statistics from the Department of Communities, Culture, Tourism & Heritage, highlights ECRL's operational efficiency. Managing regular operations requires approximately 85-90% of staff time, due to ECRL's extremely low staffing levels. The lowest in the province, in



fact. This is why it is so essential to focus our efforts with the remaining 10-15% of organizational capacity.

Please note that ECRL has the second lowest level of annual operating funding of any Public Library Region. The 14,226.75 provided in public library open hours is a tremendous return in service for this investment.

Critical Work to Date

- A Reorganization of Regional Staffing: The leadership team was restructured
 to clarify areas of responsibility, increase decision-making efficiency and include
 strategic priorities. Regional Library Assistant duties and responsibilities were
 also clarified with updated job descriptions. As service provided at local library
 branches depends so critically on regional operations, it is essential that staff
 working at the Regional Office operate with maximum efficiency and
 sustainability.
- Procedures and training documentation: Past practices and procedures conducted by Regional Library Assistants were examined, and essential



documented procedures were redeveloped and clarified to maximize efficiency, sustainability, and occupational health and safety. This work was a vital step in ensuring that our regional operations are sustainable.

• IT infrastructure development: ECRL outsourced IT by hiring ScotiaComp Technologies. Hiring a company that provides their level of expertise was a transformative decision. Local branch technology (computers, printers, scanners, etc.) has been significantly improved and are now far better maintained than they were in the past. Upgrades and IT improvements will continue to be a top priority in 2025-2026.

ECRL's Strategic Pillars

- 1. Sustain core (traditional) public library services: We heard from the community that traditional or core public library services, such as the borrowing of books, are a top priority. These foundational services must be maintained and prioritized despite various financial pressures.
- 2. Increase access to library services and facilities: Since 2012, ECRL has increased its total open hours by 50.06%. They increased from 9,480.75 in 2012 to 14,226.75 in 2023. Increasing access to library services and facilities has always been a strategic priority for the Board and will continue to be a key priority in our strategic operational plan.
- 3. Advocate for public library services: Implement a communications and public relations strategy that explains, publicizes, and advocates for public library services. It is crucial to establish an accurate perception of our services and their value to the community and our Municipal partners. We need public support and goodwill to help find funding solutions for our annual operations.
- **4. Engage the community and Municipal partners:** Build on the communication strategy to create opportunities for dialogue. We need to hear from community and Municipal partners about their perceptions of our work, their service priorities, and any opportunities for partnership development.
- 5. Amplify Equity, Diversity, Inclusion, and Accessibility (EDIA): The library must reflect the community, and our EDIA work is the way to make this a reality. A key initiative of the upcoming year is on establishing our Accessibility Advisory



Committee and reviewing our communications, both internal and externally to ensure they align with accessibility standards.

ECRL Operational Projects & Activities for 2025-2026

Please note that many of the following activities will be funded by grants, donations, increased Municipal funding or be achieved through strategic partnerships. ECRL has historically been very successful finding alternate means to fund projects which can make our annual funding challenges more confusing for the public to understand. Where possible we will highlight funding sources in the following:

1. Sustain core (traditional) public library services: Regular operations involve many activities that support and sustain core public library services. Highlighted below are special projects that involve significant upgrades or are unusually complex or large pieces of work.
